### **Botany Public School - Daily School Routine**

### **Morning Arrival and Afternoon Dismissal times**

Supervision in our playground begins at 8.30am each morning. We do ask parents to bring their children to school after this time so they are supervised in the back playground. They are not to play or stay in the courtyard as there is no supervision.

Our school has *Out of School Hours* centre for families if they need to leave their child at school before this time.

When the morning bell rings parents are asked to sit on the silver seats around the outside of the courtyard so that students and teachers can listen carefully to morning assembly.

In the afternoon, the students in K-2 are collected from outside the classrooms or courtyard. If they are in Years 3-6, please organise a meeting place with your child.

If you are going to be late to school please ring the school to advise us.

### Student Attendance - Reminder

It is expected that if your child is late to school that you, as a parent or carer, walk into the office to sign your child in to school. Children should be at school, on time every day to enable optimal learning to occur. The morning session is an uninterrupted learning time.

Children who are late are interrupting their learning and that of their peers because they miss key instructional information which then has to be repeated for the latecomers. Please help everyone by getting to school on time and showing respect for everyone's learning.

Thank you to those of you who provide an explanation as to why your child is away. Attendance is monitored by both the teachers and the Home school Liaison Officer. Children should be at school unless they are sick or there is another valid reason for the absence. For optimal learning to occur, students need to be at school, on time, every day with a healthy lunch and all their equipment.

### Sending money to school

There is a money letterbox outside the office in the school foyer and all payments and notes can be placed here before school. Payment envelopes are available to allow office staff to quickly record details for our students.

#### **Office News**

A reminder: A permission note must be completed for every student in the family for all activities.

Please note the office does not carry change, can you please provide the correct money with your orders.

Caps can be purchased from the office at \$12.50.

#### **Absences Notes**

Absence notes should be given to each child's teacher on the day they return to school. Explanations should be clearly outlined so the reason for the absence can be accurately recorded.

If you are intending to take leave for more than three days, and you know in advance, it is important that this be discussed with the school as an application for leave may be required. If your child is absent for longer than three days it is important that you contact the school to let them know the reason for the absence.

Please note: As a Westpac-hosted solution cardholder and account details will be held securely, helping to protect the school and its customers from fraudulent transactions as well as assisting in meeting the Payment Card Industry Data Security Standard (PCIDSS) compliance requirements.

Please note, once your payment is made online, we still require signed permission notes for all excursions and sports for each child participating in the activity to be sent to the office. Please also ensure you enter your child's name and not your own.







#### **DOUBLE PARKING**

Do not double park at any time. Double parking is illegal and dangerous especially around schools It reduces visibility and blocks the road for other motorists.

FINE EXCEEDS \$337 + 2 DEMERIT POINTS

#### **U TURNS**

- Performing U turns or 3 point turns in school zones is extremely dangerous.
- Performing U turns across unbroken centre lines is illegal and is particularly dangerous around schools.

FINE EXCEEDS \$337 + 3 DEMERIT POINTS

#### PARKING/STOPPING **NEAR INTERSECTIONS**

It is illegal to park or stop less than 10m from an intersection without lights as this blocks visibility for turning drivers and creates a hazard for all motorists.

FINE EXCEEDS \$448 + 2 DEMERIT POINTS

#### **PEDESTRIAN CROSSINGS &** CHILDREN'S CROSSINGS

- Slow down as you approach pedestrian crossings and children's crossings.
- Do not proceed if the road beyond the crossing is blocked.
- Do not stop or park in the No Stopping zones on either side of the crossing as this blocks v isibility.
- At a children's crossing you must stop at or before the stop line if there is a pedestrian about to cross or already on the crossing.
- Do not proceed through a children's crossing until all pedestrians have completely cleared the crossing.

FINE EXCEEDS \$448 + 2 DEMERIT POINTS



#### HOLDING HANDS IN TRAFFIC

- Children need assistance in the traffic environment. until at least the age of 10. They are not equipped physically or developmentally to make the crucial decisions to keep themselves safe.
- All children need to be actively supervised in and around moving vehicles including on footpaths, shared paths, driveways and car parks; at traffic lights, zebra and other road crossings; and on quiet streets and busy roads.
- Your children are always watching and want to be just like adults. Make sure you always set a good example around traffic and talk to your children about why you are stopping at the kerb and what you are watching and listening for. Explain where and when it is safe to cross and why.
- Hold hands with your children around traffic. If your hands are full, make sure your child holds onto your bag, pram or even your arm or sleeve.

Fines and demerit points for school parking infringements are determined by the State Government and subject to change,

Road Rules Reminders





### NO STOPPING ZONES

No Stopping signs mean you must not stop here at any time. If times of operation are shown on the sign, the restriction applies only at those times.

An unbroken yellow kerb line is a no stopping line. You must not stop for any reason.

FINE EXCEEDS \$337 + 2 DEMERIT POINTS






### **BUS ZONE SIGNS**

A Bus Zone is a No Stopping zone for vehicles other than buses. If times of operation are shown on the sign, the restriction applies only at those times.

You must not park your vehicle less than 20 metres before or 10 metres after a bus stop.

FINE EXCEEDS \$337 + 2 DEMERIT POINTS





### NO PARKING ZONES

You can only stop in a No Parking zone while picking up or setting down passengers or goods. You have a maximum of 2 minutes from the time you stop and must stay within 3 metres of your vehicle at all times. If times of operation are shown on the sign, the restriction applies only at those times. THIS IS NOT A WAITING ZONE.

FINE EXCEEDS \$187 + 2 DEMERIT POINTS





### TIME RESTRICTED PARKING

Parking signs with specified time limits allow drivers to park their vehicle for a maximum period of time, eg 5 minutes, 1 hour etc. If times of operation are shown on the sign, the restriction applies only at those times.

FINE EXCEEDS \$112





#### **DRIVEWAYS AND FOOTPATHS**

- When exiting or entering a driveway a vehicle must give way to pedestrians on the footpath.
- Driveways are not playgrounds. Be aware that children can go unnoticed in front and behind your vehicle. Do not solely rely on reverse sensors or cameras in your vehicle
- Always supervise and hold a child's hand near/ crossing driveways.
- It is illegal to park in or across any driveway or to block a footpath at any time.

FINE EXCEEDS \$337 + 2 DEMERIT POINTS



#### USING MOBILE PHONES

- It is illegal to make or receive a call on your mobile phone while you are driving unless your phone is secured in a fixed mounting or does not require you to touch or manipulate the phone in any way.
- It is illegal to use the other features of a mobile phone such as texting, emailing etc unless your car is legally parked and the ignition is switched
- Using mobile phones is a major distraction for drivers and incurs higher fines and demerit points in school zones.
