NAPLAN Information

The National Assessment Program (Literacy and Numeracy) will be conducted for all students in Years 3 and 5 in Week 3 Term 2 on the 14, 15 and 16 May 2019. On Tuesday 19 March at 6.30pm (immediately preceding the P&C Meeting) we will be sharing information about NAPLAN including what the assessment looks like and how we prepare our students for the assessment. The information presented will be useful for all interested parents. We especially encourage parents of our students in years 3 & 5 to attend the meeting.

Leadership Assembly - Harmony Day

On Thursday 21 March, we will be holding our School Leadership Assembly at 9.00am in the hall on Harmony Day. At this special assembly, Matt Thistlethwaite MP will join us, as we present our student leaders with certificates and badges. Our student leaders play an important role in our school as they help to lead our school community.

Bully No Way

The SRC has decided that this year, we will have a specific focus on 'Bullying - No Way' on Thursday 14 March. Students will be given a wristband to reinforce 'Taking a Stand Together' against bullying. The SRC will be discussing 'Anti Bullying' ideas with their classmates in an aim that we can continue to have a school that is proactive and clearly does not accept bullying. As well as this, over the next few weeks, all of our students will be participating in lessons that discuss the issue of 'bullying' as part of our Bounce Back Program.

Some conflicts between children are a normal part of growing up and do happen sometimes. Our teaching staff ensure that Restorative Practices are used to resolve these issues and restore friendships. At our school, we do not accept 'bullying' in any form.

How do I communicate with my child's teacher?

- For minor issues, directly contact your child's teacher to clarify information by speaking with them or emailing the school email, which will then be forwarded to the teachers' email.
- Please do not email the teacher directly as this is a break in protocol. Teachers' emails are private. Thank you for understating and adhering to this protocol.
- Please do not enter a classroom without the presence of a teacher.
- Please do not speak to your child's teacher at morning lines as this is the start of the school day and teachers are already engaging with their students
- For more serious concerns, please contact the school office via the school email or phone call. The appropriate staff member will speak with you as soon as possible.
- All of the teaching staff at our school have a full time teaching load, so will only be able to call you, in most • cases, during their recess or lunch breaks. Please be assured that ALL staff take your concerns seriously and will communicate with you to discuss your issues as soon as possible after the event.

Your co-operation is sought and appreciated in maintaining a safe and happy school, for together we make a great school, even better.



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High School Applications for year 6 Students – Year 7 2020

Information for students in Year 6 this year who will be starting High School in 2020 will be sent home today. Paperwork will have the students local High School printed on the application form. For most families, our local High School is South Sydney High School which provides comprehensive educational programs for students. If students wish to apply for a High School that is outside their local area, they will need to complete the necessary paperwork as part of the process for enrolling in these schools. School fees are due now. All families are asked to make a payment by Friday 22 March.

Sending money to school

There is a money letterbox outside the office in the school foyer and all payments and notes can be placed here before school. Payment envelopes are available to allow office staff to quickly record details for our students.

A reminder: A permission note must be completed for every student in the family for all activities.

Please note the office does not carry change, can you please provide the correct money with your orders.

Caps can be purchased from the office at \$12.50.

Absences Notes

Absence notes should be given to each child's teacher on the day they return to school. Explanations should be clearly outlined so the reason for the absence can be accurately recorded.

If you are intending to take leave for more than three days, and you know in advance, it is important that this be discussed with the school as an application for leave may be required. If your child is absent for longer than three days it is important that you contact the school to let them know the reason for the absence.

Arrival and Departure Procedures

Student ARRIVAL AND DEPARTURE times will be recorded from the ADMINISTRATION OFFICE if they arrive after the 9am bell or if leaving school earlier than 3pm. Please note the importance of prompt arrival to school each and every day. Prime learning time is in the morning, occasionally students are late for any manner of reasons and that is unavoidable. Once the bell has gone, students are required to attend the office for a late note.

Regular records of lateness and early leaving are deemed unexplained and unacceptable. These cases are monitored by regional staff - Home School Liaison Officer.

Likewise, school finishes at 3pm. All students are to be picked up at that time. No student is to wait outside the gate unsupervised waiting for a parent or carer to pick them up. Before and After School Care is available on our school site. Thank you to every parent and carer – your support of our school is very much appreciated.

As the newsletter is available "online", you are encouraged to use this facility if you have internet access at work or at home. You may either view or download the newsletter from the website or have the newsletter emailed to you each fortnight. To receive the newsletter by email you will need to go to the school's website and click on "Newsletters". On this page you can subscribe to receive the newsletter "online".

Please note: As a Westpac-hosted solution cardholder and account details will be held securely, helping to protect the school and its customers from fraudulent transactions as well as assisting in meeting the Payment Card Industry Data Security Standard (PCIDSS) compliance requirements.

Please note, once your payment is made online, we still require signed permission notes for all excursions and sports for each child participating in the activity to be sent to the office. Please also ensure you enter your child's name and not your own.
