#### National Assessment Program - Literacy and Numeracy 2019

A reminder that students in Years 3 and 5 will complete the National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy from 14 – 21 May 2019. If you wish to discuss any matters relating to NAPLAN testing, please see Mrs Holmes.

NAPLAN will assess the literacy and numeracy skills of students across Australian schools. The results of the tests will provide important information to schools about what each student can do, and will be used to support teaching and learning programs. Parents will receive a report indicating their child's level of achievement against the national minimum standard later in the year.

#### **Student Absences**

- The Department of Education deems that all students must attend school every day.
- Families are also advised that holidays should be taken during school holiday periods.
- If your child is absent from school please notify the school in writing by either sending an email to the school email or sending a note to the class teacher explaining the absence.
- If your child is sick for one day, you DO NOT need to ring the school but can send a note to school with your child on the following day.
- If absences are not explained, a letter will be sent home from the class teacher asking parents to explain.
- Absences are recorded in the class roll and this roll is admissible as evidence in a court of law.
- Partial absences are also recorded in the roll, where a child arrives late to school or leaves school early.
- If a student is late to school, a parent should escort them to the office so they can give the reason for the late arrival.
- Sleeping in, bad traffic and general lateness are not justifiable reasons for being late to school and these absences are marked as unjustified.
- Students, who are constantly late to school, miss the morning lesson introduction leading to gaps in learning.
- Please endeavour to maximize your child's attendance at school to ensure that they have the best start possible, every day!

#### **School Buildings and Grounds**

#### Intention to apply: Year 5 entry to an OC - Opportunity Class in 2020

Opportunity classes cater for highly achieving academically gifted students who may otherwise be without classmates at their own academic and social level. These schools help gifted and talented students to learn by grouping them with other gifted and talented students, teaching them in specialised ways and providing educational materials at the appropriate level.

Applications for opportunity class placement are considered mainly on the basis of the Opportunity Class Placement Test results and school assessment scores. The Opportunity Class Placement Test will be held on **Wednesday 31 July 2019**.

If you would like to have your child considered for Year 5 opportunity class entry in 2020, you need to apply soon. You will need to apply on the internet using a valid email address (not the student's email address).

Detailed instructions on how to apply online will be available from **Tuesday 30 April 2019** at <a href="https://education.nsw.gov.au/public-schools/selective-high-schools-and-opportunity-classes/year-5">https://education.nsw.gov.au/public-schools/selective-high-schools-and-opportunity-classes/year-5</a>. The application website opens on **Tuesday 30 April 2019** and closes on **Friday 17 May 2019**.

- No late applications will be accepted and there are no paper application forms.
- If you do not have internet access, you could apply at a public library.
- If you have a disability that prevents you from using a computer, you can contact the Unit for assistance after **30** April **2019**.
- You must submit only ONE application for each student.

#### **Positive environments**

It is important that our NSW public schools are positive environments and that parents and carers are kept informed of students' progress and school announcements.

- communication from school staff will be timely, polite and informative.
- professional relationships with school staff are based on transparency, honesty and mutual respect.

#### Communicating with our schools

#### Unacceptable behaviour may include but is not limited to:

- Aggressive or intimidating language, including the use of obscenities, making sexist, racist or derogatory comments or using a rude tone.
- · Treating members of the school community differently due to aspects such as their religion or disability.
- · Inappropriate and time wasting communication.









#### **Stewart House Donation Drive 2019**

Each year 1,800 public school children in need visit Stewart House from many parts of NSW and the ACT. During their stay, children are provided with optometric, dental and medical treatment as well as emotional support. This is balanced with health and educational programs and out of school activities to boost their self-esteem and to promote a healthier lifestyle.

Children in the care of Stewart House attend a specific purpose school onsite for 8 days of their 12 day stay. The NSW Department of Education and Communities provides infrastructure and staffing support for this school. All others costs associated with the children's stay are met from charitable donations. Stewart House relies on donations to ensure they can continue to provide these important services to children.



#### Cost per child for their Stewart House stay

Supervision and care = \$70 per child per day
Accommodation, food & transport = \$40 per child per day
Wellbeing & additional health care = \$20 per child per day

Total cost per day = \$130 per child Total cost for 12 day visit = \$1560 per child
