School Concert

Our school is very fortunate to have such creative and passionate teachers who are inspired to create such an amazing concert for our students and community. The concert tickets sold out extremely quickly again this year and we know this has caused concern. We have reserved a number of seats and are trying to accommodate as many families as possible. If you purchased a large number of tickets and are able to share these with other families can you please contact the school office.

Staff have been discussing how we can allow tickets to be more equitably distributed to the community. The Juniors has a capacity of 500 seats and are unable to limit the number of tickets sold online. One option is to allocate 2 tickets per family and organise this at a school level. This would incur an increase in ticket prices for admin purposes. Another idea is to seek out a larger venue which has a large enough area to accommodate the students back stage. We are researching costs surrounding a new venue for next year with an 800 seat capacity. As our school continues to grow towards 300 students, we would have to ensure that families were offered tickets equitably.

We have a DVD being made of the concert at a cost of \$20. A note will go home shortly for you to pre order your DVD. We thank everyone for their support & look forward to sharing the evening with you.

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Office News

Sending money to school

Please note due to DET audit requirements we are no longer able to process payments over the phone or via mail. All credit card payments are to be made in person at the office in the mornings up until 9.30am or via our online payment system. Payments can be made in one of three ways:

- 1. Send your payment in as soon as possible in a labelled envelope with your child.
- 2. Pay online on our website (Preferred Option).
- 3. Pay in person at the office.

Please note the office does not carry change, can you please provide the correct money with your payments. Please place all money in an envelope with a note.

There is a money letterbox outside the office in the school foyer and all payments and notes can be placed here before school. Payment envelopes are available to allow staff to quickly record details for our students.

Caps can be purchased from the office at \$12.50

Use of Playground Equipment after school hours

Please note that our Botany Out Of School Hours Care (OOSH) have a contract to use our school grounds after school every day from 3.15pm. Please be advised that all students need to have vacated our school playground by this time so that the OOSH Staff can easily identify students in their care. There can be up to 70 students at our OOSH on any given afternoon. Thank you for your cooperation with this matter.

Administering Medication

The school has a set policy on the administering of medication, which aligns directly with the departmental policy.

The departmental policy reads as follows: Prescription medication cannot be given unless accompanied by a signed and dated request form. This form is available from the front office. Medication must be in the original prescription container so dosages can be double-checked. All medication must be taken to the office and dosage recorded. Please do not send medication with your child to hand in for safety reasons. **Non-prescription medication cannot be administered.**


School Enrolments and Numbers for 2019

The end of 2018 is fast approaching and we have now begun planning for 2019. Please inform the school as soon as possible in writing if your child is not returning to Botany Public School in 2019, or if your child is starting kindergarten 2019, and you have not yet informed the office.



The safety of of all students, staff and visitors is our first priority. Therefore we ask that dogs are not brought onto school premises.

The Companion Animals Act 1998 (the Act) provides that dogs are prohibited from school grounds whether they are leashed or unleashed. It is an offence which carries a penalty ranging from \$1,100 to \$11,000 depending on whether the dog is designated a dangerous breed or not.
